

Tyre factory creates jobs in KZN



Sumitomo Rubber South Africa has invested about R970 million in the South African economy.

KWAZULU-NATAL to benefit from foreign investment by a Japanese tyre company.

About 600 jobs have been created in Ladysmith KwaZulu-Natal thanks to a R970 million direct investment by Japanese tyre manufacturing company Sumitomo Rubber South Africa (SRSA).

Sumitomo manufactures the popular Dunlop, Sumitomo and Falken tyre brands. It has taken a step further by recently launching its new, state-of-the-art Truck and Bus Radial (TBR) factory.

Ladysmith mayor Vincent Mayiboyi Madlala said the investment from the Asian company was not just about the people of Ladysmith but will also benefit the province through job creation and growing the economy.

"The factory has created about 600 job opportunities in the municipality of Ladysmith since the inception of the company in our city. With the new expansion it is expected to create a further 400 permanent jobs," said Madlala.

He added that with skills shortage being a challenge in Ladysmith, Sumitomo also took to other areas in the province such as Richards Bay and Escourt providing decent jobs for people in those areas.

"In some cases the company has taken people from our province for training in other countries in our continent where they have a footprint. To us this is boosting skills development for people in our city and province,"

Mayor Madlala added.


Production Trainee Specialist at the SRSA factory, Sifiso Vilakazi is one of the people who has been equipped with skills.

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Drawing roads in the sky

A CAREER THAT may not be popular to most young people exposed Chepape to a whole new world.

Pilots do not just fly aeroplanes all over the sky; they have to use certain routes and follow procedures to ensure that they take-off and land safely.

The only way for pilots to know which route to follow from one airport to another is through services of a Flight Procedure Design Specialist.

This Transport month, Vuk'uzenzele spoke to Mpho Chepape (29) who is one of the four Flight Procedure Design Specialists at the Air Traffic Navigation Services (ATNS).

ATNS is a company that renders air traffic control and management solutions for South Africa, as well as 10 percent of the world's airspace.

Chepape's job is to design routes for use by air traffic controllers and pilots. He said

a key priority in his field of work is safety.

"We design route procedures both locally and internationally to protect flights from crashing into obstacles such as buildings and other structures. What I normally

tell people when they ask me about my job is that I draw roads in the sky," he said.

Chepape said safety is number one priority in aviation, so he constantly has to analyse the environment where flights will be taking off and where

they will be landing in order to avoid unfortunate incidents.

Part of his job is to liaise with stakeholders including pilots, airports management, air traffic controllers and the South African Weather Services in order for him to design

efficient flight procedures.

He said his job is exciting yet complex because the environment is not always the same.

"Every day is different, so there is no routine in designing the routes for flights," he said.

He joined the company in 2011 as an air traffic service officer.

"I had no idea that there are Flight Procedure Design Specialists. I only learned about this when I was an Air Traffic Service Officer and then I applied to get the job," he said.

Chepape has undergone an extensive flight procedure design course at the Air Navigation Institute in Switzerland and then received 12 to 18 months on-the-job training.

Chepape adds that high school scholars interested in pursuing a career in flight procedure design should ensure that they do well in Mathematics and Science. ■



Aku na kamara ya ku dyondzela yo a-ntswa ya muinjhiniyere loyi a ha ku sungulaka ntirho ku fana na ndhawu ya yumaki leyi nga na ritshuri na ku nga ringanani yi thlela yi heleketiwa hi michini ya mpongo na vavanuna na vavasati lava xirirkaka minyuku va tiyimisele eka ntirho wa vona.

Thabiso Dladla na Sumay Maharaj i vainjhiniyere vo pfuneta va kwala ndhawini (ti-ARE) lava va dyondza ka mitirho na maendlelo ku suka eka vatirhikulobye eka gondzo ra N2 leri nga eku Antswisiweni exikarhi ka Mthunzini na eMpangeni eRibuweni ra N'walungu ra KwaZulu-Natal.

Maharaj loyi a sunguleke eka phurojeke leyi hi Mhawuri 2016, naswona khale a tirhana na ku lulamisa tiphevhumente na ku endla vuhaniganisi bya magondzo hi tikhomputara ePort Elizabeth eka Senthara ya Vuswikoti ya SANRAL, u vule leswaku se u dyondze tidyondzo to tala ta nkoka hi mpfhuka a rhurhela en'walungu. "Ndzi dyondze

Dladla u ti kume a ri eka phurojeke leyi kwalomu ka

khume ra tin'hweti endzhaku ka loko a ngenele eka nongonoko wa valeteriwa kusuka eka SANRAL.

U tsake ngopfu ku tikuma a ri karhi a tirha eka phurojeke leyi ya ku tlhontlha leyi a yi hlamuselaka tanihi leyi yi hambanekehambaneke na ku katsaka na mabiloho ya nga ri yangani na tiphayiphi leti khulukisaka mati ehansi ka magondzo.

"Ndzi tikume ndzi nghenisa xandla eka swikambelo na ku pfuna mukontiraka laha a lavaka ku vekiwa erivaleni eka leswi dirowiweke. Loko swi ta eka mitirho ya misava, hi tlhela hi endla swikambelo eka tinhundzu leti tiyeke xikan'we na switiriswa leswi nga ehansi ka vuhaniganisi bya gondzo. Sweswinyana ha ha ku sungula ku endla ntirho wo hlanganisa swiribyana na sandi swi nga leswi hi le ku tirhiseni ka BTB naswona hi endla swikambelo swa miti-

Mikarhi yin'wana ku na ku kanganyiseka ka fambelo ra mahungu, ngo-pfungopfu eka thlelo ra swo dirowa, na tidirowingi leti nga hetisekangiki na swin'wana swo fana na swona. Hi swona swi endlaka leswaku swi va na nkoka leswaku vatirhi va vuinjhiniyere va va kona eka ndhawu ya vuaki ku hlamula swivutiso leswi hinkwaswo," ku vule Sumay. ■

Ndzawulo ya Dyondzo ya le Hansi yi sime-kile nonganoko lowu nga ta vuyerisa vadyondzi vo-tala kusuka eka miganga ya le matikoxikaya lava tidyondzo ta vona ti nga ta xiymo xa le hansi. Phurojeke ya Mpfuno wa Dyondzo ya le Matikoxikaya (REAP) i nonganoko wa malembe manharhu lowu wu nga ta sungula ku tirha kusuka hi 2018 kufika hi 2021 ku va ku langutisiwa loko xigava lexi xo sungula xi ta tira, naswona yi languteriwe ku vuyerisa kwalomu ka 188 wa swikolo eAfrika-Dzonga hi nkarhi lowu.

Ndzawulo yi tshemba leswaku leswi swi ta nghenisa xandla eku antswiseni ka xiymo xa ku dyondza na ku dyondzisa eka tindhawu ta kusuka ematikoxikaya.

Nonganoko lowu eka nkarhi wa sweswi wu le ku ringetiweni eka tidisitiriki timbirhi eka swifundzakulu swinharhu swa le matikoxikaya leswi swi nga tirhiki kahle. Leti tikatsa Tidisitiriki ta le Ribuweni ra Vuxa bya Alfred Nzo na OR Tambo eKa-

pa-Vuxa, Tidisitiriki ta ILe-mbe na UMzinyathi eKwa-Zulu-Natal, na Tidisitiriki ta Sekhukhune na Mopani eLimpopo.

Mulawurinkulu wa Vuantswisi na Nsimiko wa Kharikhulamu eka Ndzwulo ya Dyondzo ya le Hansi Seliki Tlhabane, u vurile leswaku ndzwulo yi thorile vantshwa va kwalomu ka 750 lava nga na metiriki leswaku va Vapfuneti eka Dyondzo ya le swikolweni swa le Matikoxikaya.

"Va kume vuleteri lebyi nga ta va pfuna ku tirha mitirho-leyi va averiweke yona. Va ta rhumeriwa eka mitlawa ya le hansi na leyi nga exikarhinya-nya leyi katsaka tigireyidi ta 1 ku ya fika eka 4," u hlamuserile.

Vapfuneti va Dyondzo ya le Matikoxikaya va languteriwa ku pfuna hi migingiriko ya tidyondzo yo hambanahambana, ngopfungopfu ku antswisa tinhlayo, vuswikoti byo tsala na ku hlaya. "Leyi i ndlela yin'wana yo nyika vantshwa matimba kusuka eka tindhawu leti ikhonomi yi nga ehansi hi nhluvukiso wa vuswikoti na ntokoto wa

ntirho," ku vule Tlhabanea.

U vurile leswaku Vapfuni va Dyondzo ya le Matikoxikaya va languteriwa ku hunguta ndzhwalo lowu vadyondzisi va swikolo va le matikoxikaya va nga na wona hi ku va pfuna eka migingiriko yo engetela ya tidyondzo ku fana na ku langutisia titlilabu ta mitirhokaya, titlilabu ta tinhlayo, titlilabu ta ku hlaya, titlilabu ta vutshila bya vumbuluxi na tiphurojeke ta vurimi.

Nhloko ya Xikolo Ntombikayise Mkhize wa Xikolo xa le Hansi xa Ozwathini endhawini ya le Nodwengu eka disitiriki ya Ilembe u tshe-mba leswaku nonganoko lowu wu ta pfuna vadyondzi vo hlaya va yena lava va tikeriwa ku hlaya na tinhlayo.

You might have experienced technical glitches when applying for the Funza Lushaka Bursary but thanks to a new and improved online system this will be a thing of the past.

The Department of Basic Education under the guidance of the State Information Technology Agency or SITA has undergone a process to migrate the Funza Lushaka Online Registration System to a more fluid and effective online system.

"We are excited about the modernised system, we have experienced many challenges in fully achieving on the

high ambitions we have for the administration of the bursary programme," said Funza Lushaka Bursary

Programme Director Gerrit Coetzee.

He added that in moving into a new era he was

confident that the system will allow for an improved management of the Bursary Programme.

The Funza Lushaka bursary programme is a multi-year programme that promotes the recruitment of people to study teaching with the ultimate goal of encouraging teaching in public schools as a profession among people under the age of 30.

The Modernised system will allow for more seamless registration of candidates on the front end while allowing for improved selection, monitoring and placement of candidates and beneficiaries while further strengthening

identification of defaulting bursars and reinforcing the monitoring of the NSFAS distribution process.

As a key lever towards improving the overall quality of teaching, the bursaries are made available to enable eligible students to complete a teaching qualification in an area of national priority.

Recipients of these bursaries are required to teach at a public school for the same number of years that they received the bursary.

Current and prospective candidates are encouraged to visit the Funza Lushaka website to apply for the 2019 Funza Lushaka intake.
