R25 billion for Waterberg development

President Cyril Ramaphosa has announced R25 billion for infrastructure projects in the Waterberg District Municipality in Limpopo.

The projects are expected to, among other things, address issues of severe water shortages in the district which is made up of the Bela-Bela, Lephalale, Modimolle-Mookgophong, Mogalakwena and Thabazimbi local municipalities.

Addressing residents at the Shongoane Sports Ground in Lephalale recently, the President said government would in the next five years complete the Moloko Water Resource Project.

During the period, government would also pursue the Waterberg rail-line and build several much-needed schools in various communities in the district.

“We know that the people of this district are confronted with severe unemployment and poverty. We know about the problems of water, electricity, sanitation and roads. We know about access to land,” he said.

Government, he said, was also aware of the poor telecommunications network that frustrates economic development in the area.

“We need to attract investment in the area. We recently held the second SA Investment Conference and we raised R363 billion from private investment,” he said.

A portion of that money was to be invested in the mining district.

“Government will invest R25 billion over the next five years, and that’s a lot of money. Some companies will in this

Kuphela kwemshado ngekwemtsetfo

Nasewulunge konkhe longakwenta kutsi umshado wakho uphumelele, idivosi kungaba yintfo lencono kini nobabili wena nemlingani wakho. Idivosi ilukhuni futsi ibanga sitresi emindenini kantsi futsi nenchubo yetemtsetfo ingakudida.

Idivosi ngulesikhatsi umshado uphela ngekwemtsetfo enkantolo yemtsetfo. Kunetinhlobo letimbili tedivosi: lengaphikiswa – lapho khona omabili emacembu avumelana kutsi idivosi kufanele kutsi yenteke; futsi ingaphikiswa – lapho khona emacembu angavumelani ngaledivosi nome ngemibandzela yayo.

Josephine Peta, Sisebenti Lesikhulu seKuphatfwa kweMtsetfo eHhovisi leMmeli weMndeni eTikweni Letebulungiswa Nekutfufukiswa Kwemtsetfosisekelo, uchaza kutsi inchubo yedivosi icala ngesikhatsi kukhishwa emasamanisi.

“Umuntfu lofuna kutsi

umshado wabo uphele angatfola emasamanisi edivosi enkantolo lephakeme nome yesifundza, nome bangabonana nemmeli kutsi abasite kulenchubo. Lowo locala inchubo yedivosi emkhatsini walabo labashadile ubitwa ngekutsi ngumangali bese kutsi lolomunye yena ubitwa ngekutsi ngumangalawa,” kwasho yena njalo Peta.

Peta uchaze kutsi emasamanisi edivosi kufanele:

- asho kutsi sekute lelinye litfuba lekubuyisela lobudlelwane esimeni lesifanele,
- ente kutsi kube nekwehlukani swa kwemphahla labanayo labayihlanganyelako nome kufezekiswe imibandzela lekwa-vunyananwa ngayo ngesikhatsi kusayinwa lesivumelwane semshado ekucaleni kwalomshado, kanye,
- nekuchaza kutsi ngumaphi emalungiselelo lentelwe bantfwana balaba labashadene, njenge-

kutsi nje umntfwana utawuhlala nabani.

“Lamasamanisi kufanele kutsi aphindze futsi asho kutsi ummangalawa unetinsuku leti-10 – nangabe ahlala endzaweni yinye nemmangali, nome tinsuku letinge-20 – nangabe lamacembu ahlala etifundzeni letahlukene, kute aphendvule lamasamanisi,” kwengeta Peta.

Nangabe licala selivuliwe, emadokhumenti atfunyeliwa emuva kummangali, lokunguye lotsatsa emasethi lamabili alamadokhumenti ayowanika mabhalane wenkantolo yemajaji wakuleyo ndzawo ummangalawa lasebenta kuyo nome lahlala kuyo.


“Mabhalane wenkantolo yemajaji utawubese-ke yena utsatsa lawo madokhumenti ayowanika ummangalawa matfupha bese sewukhipha sicisekiso lesibhalwe kutsi uwentile lowo msebenti, kufakazela kutsi vele lawo madokhumenti wanikwa wona. Nangabe kunebantfwana, Lihhovisi leMmeli weMndeni kufanele kutsi

latiswe,” kwaphawula yena njalo Peta.

Emva kwetinsuku leti-10 nome letinge-20, mabhalane wenkantolo yemajaji angayibhalisa ledivosi kuluhlu lwemacala enkantolo. Kumadivosi laphikiswako, ummangalawa kufanele kutsi awaphendvule lamasamanisi ngekutsi afake satiso senhloso yekutivikela kuloludzaba.

“Nangabe asakwentile loko, kufanele kutsi aphindze futsi afake sicelo sekutiphendvulela kungakapheli sikhatsi lesitsite. Sicelo sekutiphendvulela sitatimende lapho ummangalawa aphendvula khona letinsolo labekwona letikulamasamanisi.

Emva kwalesicelo sekutiphendvulela, ummangali angaphindza futsi asiphendvule lesicelo sekutiphendvulela nome afake satiso sekutsi kuhlalwe phasi kulalelwe lelicala.

“Loludzaba lutawubese-ke selubekelwa lusuku kutsi litekwe,” kwephetsa Peta njalo. 

Yini idivosi lenga-kaphendvulwa?

Inkantolo iyayikhipha idivosi ngobe kungakaphendvulwa nangabe emasamanisi akhishiwe atfunyelwa kulowo lekushadwe naye kodvwa wangawaphendvuli ngesikhatsi lesincunyiwe. Loku-ke, nanome kunjalo, uyalulekwa kutsi ucale ngekutsintsisa lowo loshade naye ngobe ngekuhamba kwesikhatsi angalinga kutsi ledivosi ibekwe eceleni ngesizatfu sekutsi kunesizatfu lesivakalako sekutsi wehluleke kugcina sikhatsi lesingumcamulajucu.

Certified documents now expire after six months

All government departments and its components have been directed to stop the practice of requiring certified copies of documents not older than three months to accompany applications for employment.

This decision follows complaints raised with President Cyril Ramaphosa on social media and through other channels about the requirements for compliance with public sector job applications.

Departments have been ad-

vised to at least accept certified copies of documents submitted with an application for employment that are up to six months old, in those cases where the document certified does not have an expiry date that falls within the six-month period, the Presidency said.

“Government has recognised that the practice to date impacts negatively on job seekers in the current economic climate in South Africa, and that there is a need to reduce the burden on job seekers to submit - with

each separate job application - certified copies of supporting documents (such as academic qualifications, which are not older than three months),” the Presidency said in a statement.

The Presidency said this change will also reduce the workload that the certification of documents creates for the South African Police Service personnel, who will now be able to devote more time to their core function of ensuring that South Africans are and feel safe. SAnews.gov.za
