

Expanded Public Works Programme Opportunity knocks

t's possibly one of the best kept secrets in the country. More than 220 000 temporary jobs have been created by a government programme, but there has been very little publicity.

Last year, government announced a new national programme to increase temporary jobs with training opportunities for unemployed people.

Today, 17 months later, the programme — called the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) — has created more than 220000 jobs through 3400 projects countrywide.

This is how it happened.

The Department of Provincial and Local Government receives grants from the national government to improve services.

The money is given to municipalities to create more jobs and train people.
